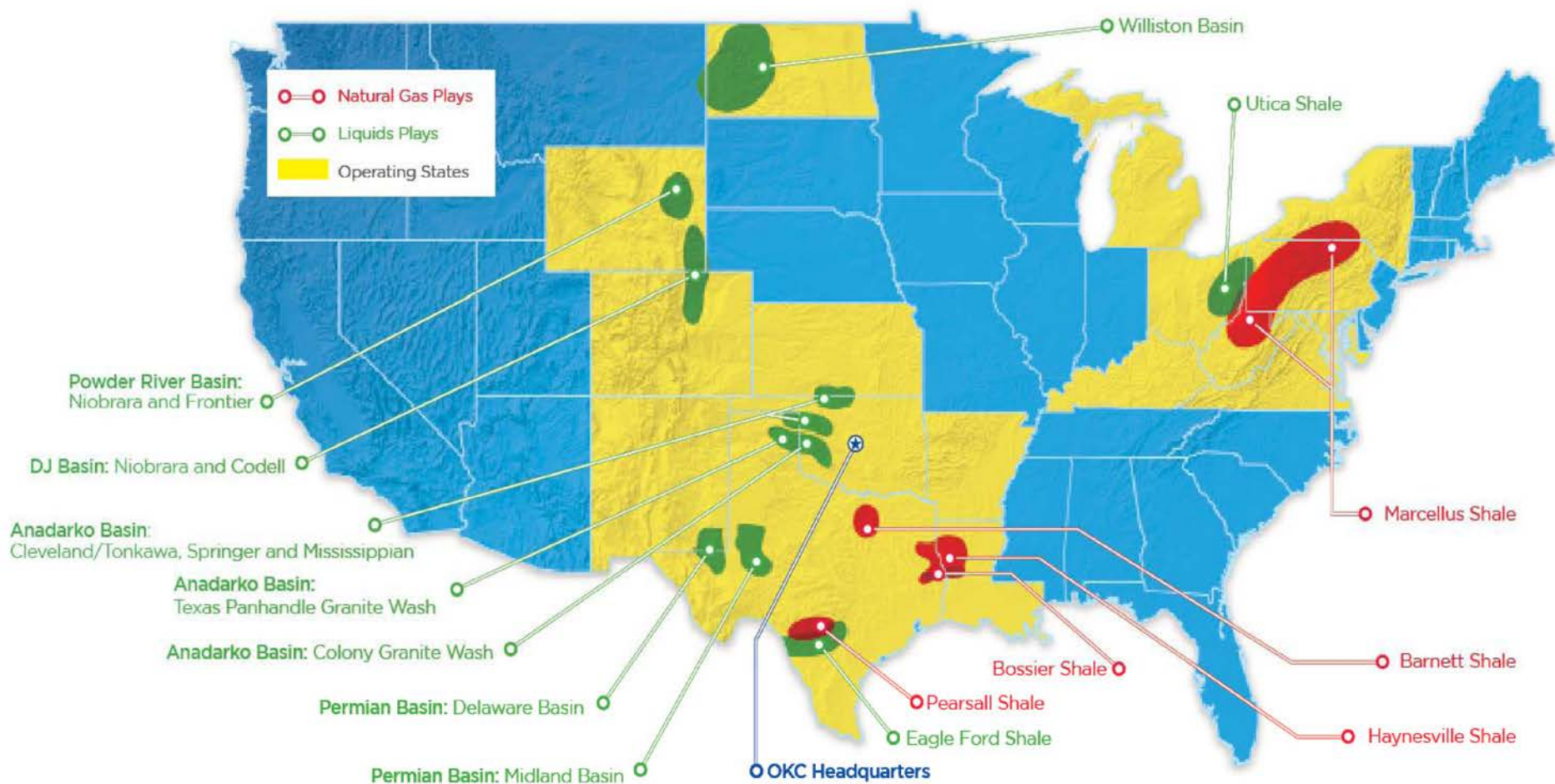


Chesapeake Energy Corporation

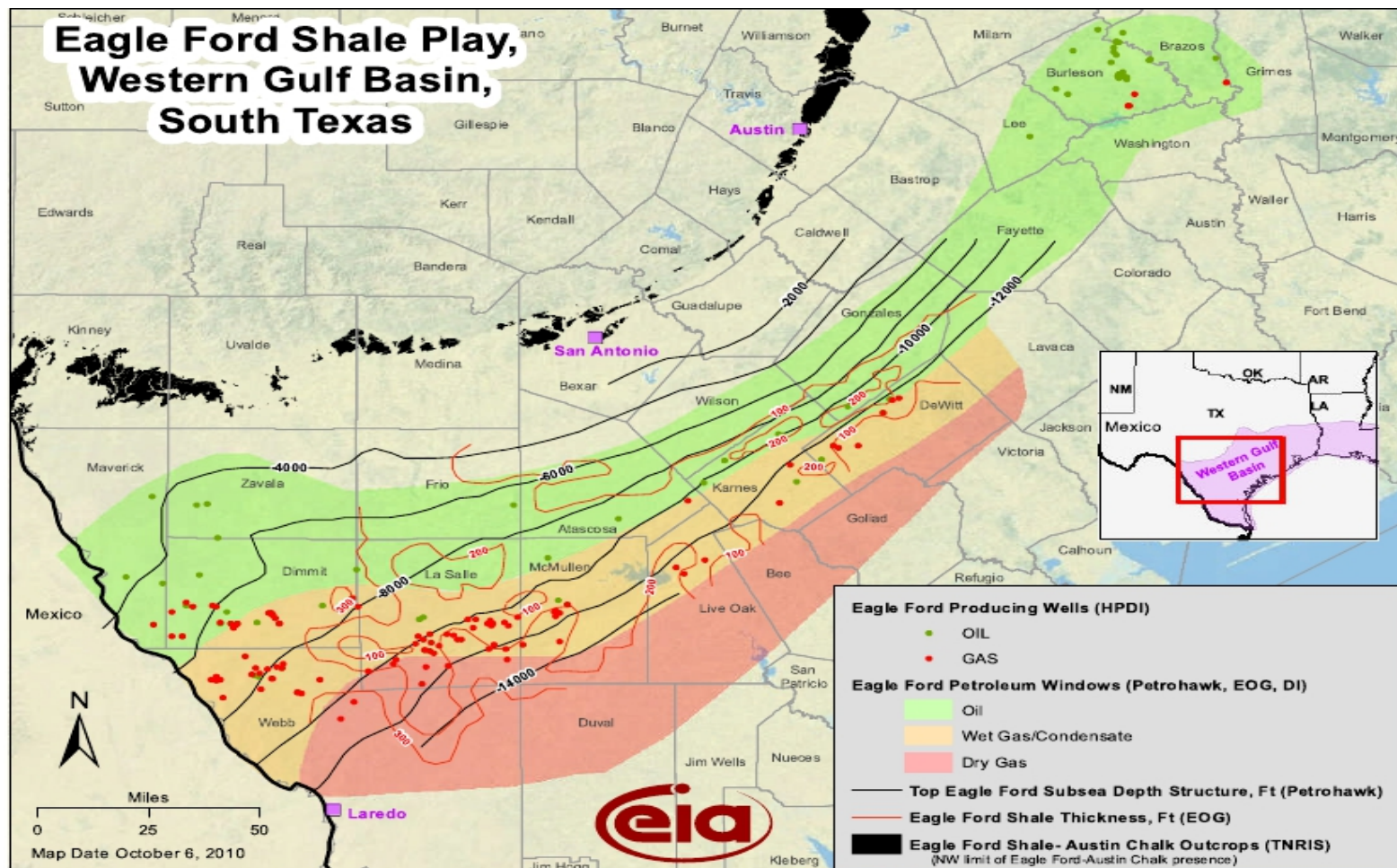
- » Second-largest producer of U.S. natural gas and a Top 15 producer of U.S. Liquids
- » Most active driller in the U.S. with 166 operated rigs*; 105 non-operated rigs and the #1 driller in the world of horizontal wells
- » Focused primarily on domestic, on-shore production
- » Fortune magazine's 100 Best Companies to Work For® four years running (2008, 2009, 2010 & 2011)
- » Named Energy Producer of the Year and received the Industry Leadership Award at annual Platts Global Energy Awards
- » Active in Texas since 1990; production in 89 counties*

Eagle Ford Shale Development Plan



- Chesapeake has an industry leading leasehold position of:
 - ~680,000 net acres
- Multiple wells drilled from a single pad
- Lateral length: 5000' - 8000'
- Days to drill well: 20 - 24 days
- Average rig count:
 - Year-end 2010: ~21 rigs
 - Year-end 2011: ~30 rigs
 - Year-end 2012: ~35 rigs

Economic Benefits in 2010

- Generated close to \$2.9 billion in total economic output
- Supported approximately 12,600 full-time jobs in the area
- Paid \$511.8 million in salaries and benefits to workers
- Provided close to \$1.3 billion of gross state product (or value-added)
- Added nearly \$61 million in State revenues including severance taxes
- Provided more than \$47 million in revenue to local governments for schools, hospitals, emergency services, etc.

Chesapeake Energy plans to ramp up operations in S.A.

Oklahoma City-based Chesapeake Energy Corp. is planning to significantly increase its presence in San Antonio next year as the company ramps up its local operations to take advantage of drilling opportunities along the Eagle Ford Shale formation in South Texas.

Chesapeake officials believe that the Eagle Ford Shale could produce as much as 1 billion barrels of oil over the next 20 years.

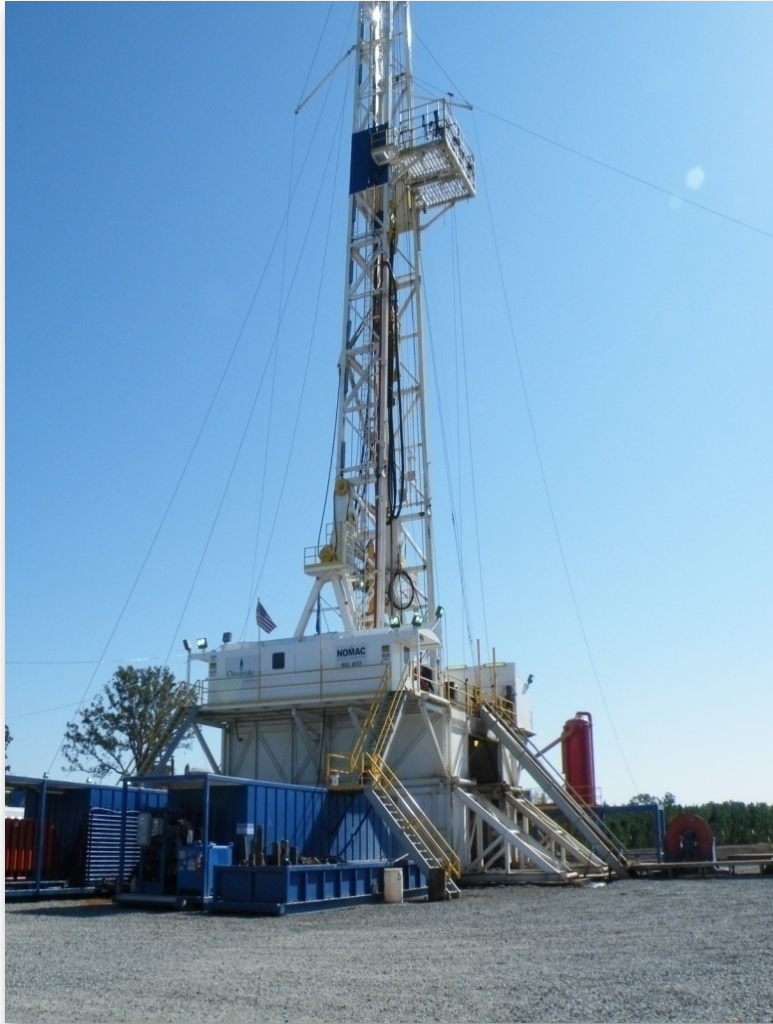
2010 Economic Benefits For Bexar Co

Creating Jobs and Better Wages

- Oil and Natural Gas Operators employ more than 315,000 people in Texas
- Average industry employee earns about \$107,000 per year
- Average for the rest of private sector jobs is closer to \$44,000 per year
- Each industry job causes a ripple effect creating as many as 17 additional construction, manufacturing, petrochemical, refining, pipeline and service jobs

Estimated Economic Benefits in 2020



- » Close to \$21.5 billion in total economic output
- » Almost 68,000 full-time jobs in the area
- » More than \$3.2 billion in salaries and benefits paid to workers
- » More than \$11.6 billion of gross state product (or value-added)
- » Approximately \$1.1 billion in State revenues including severance taxes
- » More than \$450 million in local government revenues
